A Sporting Update from Mr Cairns

Football

The Y5/6 boys' football team headed to Hartford High School on Monday for the first tournament of the year. The A team played some fantastic football. The goalkeeper and defence only conceded one goal in the whole tournament; the midfield and strikers scored some brilliant goals. They won the tournament and will go to the next round at Hartford High School on Monday 6th November.

The B team were also amazing, winning 5 matches, drawing 2 and losing 2 to finish 3rd overall. Well done to all the boys who took part.

Team Selection

The majority of our competitions are for children in Years 5 and 6. Every child in these year groups will be offered the chance to attend at least one competition each year. Some competitions, such as the football this week, lead to Partnership and County Finals. These teams are picked on ability. Other tournaments such as orienteering, golf and dodgeball are used to make sure every child has a chance to attend and enjoy a competition. Children in Years 3 and 4 have fewer competitions outside school. Those children who are ready will be selected for tag rugby, tennis, or cricket but not every child in these classes is ready for this experience.

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 do not attend competitions outside school. Instead, they experience competition in their PE lessons and the Y5 and 6 children put on extra lunch time activities for them, called Phys Kids, once their training is complete.
