## Harvest Collection for Mid-Cheshire Food Bank

A warm thank you to everybody who donated to our Harvest collection for the Mid-Cheshire food bank, which was collected yesterday. The food bank appreciate every donation – your generosity will help families in need during the coming Winter months.

#### **National Sleep Helpline**

The Sleep Charity are sending information about a wonderful free resource that can help parents and children to learn more about their sleep and develop better bedtime routines. Sleep is essential to brain function; by helping children to sleep better, we can help them to succeed in school. At any given time up to 40% of adults and 50% of children (this rises to 80% with a SEND diagnosis) have difficulties with their sleep. Yet in a recent survey, almost 60% of adults felt there was a lack of support for sleep issues.

The free helpline is run by trained sleep advisors, many of whom are specialists in working with SEND, who can talk to young people directly, or parents (they can also talk to adults, including older people, about their sleep issues). The helpline is open five times a week, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday evenings 7-9pm, and Monday, Wednesday mornings 9-11am. The number is 03303 530 541.
