Year 6 Victorian Day

On Monday, our Year 6 classes participated in a Victorian-themed day, which included learning in the Victorian style, a change to the classroom to reflect the Victorian approach to teaching, and even a taste of gruel – complete with authentic dress! Miss Miller and Miss Lee, along with Mrs Karle, Mrs Fox, Miss Kisa and Mrs McCabe, were in full role as Victorian schoolmasters; the classroom was adjusted into traditional rows and the children were thrown into life as a schoolchild in the late 1800s. Having had a peek into the classrooms, it looks like they thoroughly enjoyed the experience!

Science Week

This year our Science Week in school will be held during the week beginning 11th March. In this week, we welcome many visitors into school from our local community with science links. In the past we have had visits from parents in a wide range of science fields such as engineers, chemists, vets, doctors, geomorphologists, and microbiologists! Phonics Screening

As stated in last week's newsletter, Year 1 Phonics screening takes place <u>throughout the week commencing 10th</u> <u>June</u>. The purpose of the phonics screening check will be to confirm that all children have learned phonic decoding to an age-appropriate standard. Children who have not reached this level will receive extra support from school to ensure they can improve their decoding skills and will then have the opportunity to retake the phonics screening check.

Year 6 Bikeability – A Request

A few children have signed up to take part in our Bikeability course but do not own their own bike. We are politely asking if anybody would mind bringing their bikes in for those who are struggling to locate one – we are needing bikes for Monday 15th January. If your child has Bikeability on a different day, their bikes can be securely left in our bike shed on the school grounds ready for their session if this is easier.

Salty STEM Club at The Lion Saltworks

The Lion Saltworks host their Salty STEM club every Saturday from 10.30am-12pm. Aimed at ages 5-11, children work with the Saltworks STEM Ambassadors to conduct experiments, learn scientific facts, and engage in activities with a STEM focus.
