# Science Week Report from Mrs Clinkard and Miss Shepherd

We've have been celebrating National Science Week in school this week and it has been action packed and fun filled! We have been lucky enough to welcome a range of fabulous, inspirational visitors into school to enthuse the children about science. All year groups have taken part in a range of interactive activities throughout the week and there has been a real science 'buzz' around school! The week began with the launch of our Science Selfie competition by our Year 5 Science Ambassadors. All children in school are invited to enter and send in a photo where they are taking part in science. The closing date for this competition is 22<sup>nd</sup> March and lots of ideas /information is in the attached PowerPoint presentation.

We have enjoyed experiments with 'Super Little Scientists' and learnt about fossils on a 'fossil dig' with the 'Education Factory'. Year 6 had a super workshop with Ms Challinor from Hartford High School and learnt all about chemicals and the pigments of ink. Farmer Will and Farmer Alex from the National Farmers Union brought a tractor into Early Years and we took part in a live lesson with NFU education!
